Pupil Premium is additional funding the school receives. It is used to promote and enhance the opportunities of those children who are looked after, children from lower income families and children with one or more parents in the armed forces. Schools can choose to spend this money in one of three ways:

1. For the purposes of the school, i.e. for the educational benefit of pupils registered at that school.
2. For the benefit of pupils registered at other maintained schools or academies.
3. On community facilities, e.g. services whose provision furthers any charitable purpose for the benefit of pupils at the school or their families, or people who live or work in the locality in which the school is situated.

In addition, the grant does not have to be completely spent by schools in the financial year; some or all of it may be carried forward to future financial years.

2016-2017 Funding Allocation

At the beginning of the academic year, one child attending the school was eligible for Pupil Premium funding. The amount received during the academic year 2016-2017 was £1,320.

2016-2017 Funding Spend

Over the academic year, Pupil Premium funding has been used to part-fund additional hours of a teaching assistant in Key Stage 2. This allowed the school to create a small ‘intervention team’ of two TAs, who worked with pupils in Years 1, 2, and 3 and pupils in Years 4, 5 and 6.

Impact of the Pupil Premium spend

Key Stage 1

The table below shows the progress children eligible for Pupil Premium funding made over Year 1.

Conclusion

The child who was eligible for Pupil Premium funding in Year 1 in the academic year 2016-2017 made better progress in all areas when compared to their peers. The pupil met age-related expectations in Reading, Writing, Maths and EGPS.

Pupil Premium Funding 2016-2017

The estimated amount of additional funding to be received during the academic year 2017-2018 is £1,320. This funding is planned to be spent on:

- providing a wider range of texts to enable children to develop their early understanding in phonics;
- investing in iPad-based technologies to enhance children's understanding of letter patterns, basic number facts and early coding skills;
- providing training opportunities for support staff in phonics and number facts.
